- 7. **Report from the County Councillor.** The extent of the work in the car park is to be evaluated by PCC.

The Tour of Britain is coming through Llangynidr in September (Sunday the  $2^{nd}$ , a map of the Stage One Route is available on



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www.tourofbritain.co.uk/ ).

£13 million is to be saved by PCC in the next year. Referring to the letter of 21/6/2018 from Brecon Beacons National Park Authority (BBNPA), the total number of houses is correct but the affordable housing has been done so all that is left is the market housing.

*Clerk to find original papers for application 13/09787/OUT for GM.* The passing places created to help traffic flow after the opening of the Glanusk caravan park are narrow, RH will see if she can discover why.

8. Planning Applications – 18/16212/FUL Llys yr Awel, Orchard Lane. Orangery extension to rear elevation. *No objection*. SD *Clerk is to remind BBNPA that there are a lot of extensions going up* but few new houses.

- 18/16163/FUL Saladin House. Parking changes. GM declared *a personal interest. The map was not very clear. No objections.* - 18/16185/FUL Bridge End House. Two storey extension and re-modelling of the dwelling to allow for ground floor living. No objection. Clerk to write to BBNPA concerning the new arrangements for plans: The plans are not easily readable in A4 format making it difficult for Councillors to comment.

10. To approve, or not, a small donation to the Lychgate appeal. It is important that the Community Council does not favour one *Church or Chapel.* Resolved by majority: to not approve a donation to the Lychgate Appeal.

- 11. To invite the Brecon Beacons National Park Warden to the river bridge meeting. The clerk should ask the Warden if he would SD like to join in the litter pick on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> July.
- 12. To receive a report from the clerk of the Human Resources meeting held at 6.30pm on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> June 2018 and **determine her pay.** The Clerk's appraisal found her to be SD performing acceptably. Her pay was raised from spine point 18 to spine point 19 on the National Association of Local Councils (*NALC*) scale for part-time clerks (£303.21+£30 stationery allowance). Clerk to action.
